The Ministry of Energy has also facilitated the approval of the Onshore Exploration and Production Policy, which will potentially widen the scope of investment portfolio and make us more attractive to investors.

Content Conference The Local and Exhibition is the most important event on the Upstream Petroleum Calendar because it is the platform where the stakeholders get to review the programme of the past year and plan for the next one. It has consistently provided an opportunity to bring all the key stakeholders and international experts to help us to celebrate our success, identify our shortcomings and find innovative solutions to these challenges. We are all witnesses to the challenges facing the Upstream Petroleum Industry globally as a result of the constraints as well as the Energy Transition. The Government of Ghana's position is that our oil and gas resources cannot be left stranded. Hence, we have provided the Petroleum Commission with all the needed support to ensure that our hydro carbon resources are developed and produced to contribute to Ghana's developmental agenda.

The goal of the Petroleum sector is to make Ghana's petroleum industry transparent and sustainable for the benefit of present and future generations. In light of this, I believe this year's theme - "Attracting Exploration and Production Investments to Boost Local Content - New Pathways", is not only appropriate, but timely. We must identify innovative ways to bring in the needed investments to sustainably develop and produce our oil and gas resources.

The Ministry of Energy has provided the Petroleum Commission with all the support to advance this course, and I believe this Conference provides yet another avenue to review our current strategies and identify appropriate solutions to the challenges confronting the sector.

The sector is capital-intensive and hence cannot be developed with Government financing. We need investors! It is therefore

imperative that Ghana implements innovative policies and strategies to become one of the best investment destinations in the sub-region.

Proposal for review of Ghana's current upstream petroleum fiscal regime are receiving the necessary attention. Whilst Ghana repositions itself to attract and retain investments to produce its hydracarbons, I believe that our investor friends owe a duty to themselves to work with us in a mutually beneficial manner.

As parts of efforts to bring Ghana's hydrocarbon to the surface quickly, the Ministry of Energy has recently facilitated the approval of an onshore and exploration production policy. It is anticipated that this policy will potentially widen the scope available for investments in Ghana's upstream petroleum sector.

I expect that this Conference will discuss extensively strategies in line with the theme. I am also confident that this Conference would provide us with more ideas to expand investment into Ghana and ultimately to meet our local goals. This is significant because the oil and gas sector, unlike the power sector, needs deliberate and specific local content policies to ensure the participation of indigenes in the industry and provide the needed linkages to other sectors of the economy to ensure maximum benefits to Ghanaians.

We also hope to learn from countries like Namibia, Nigeria, Uganda, Trinidad and Tobago and Cote d'Ivoire among others who have made great inroads in terms of investment attraction.

#### Mr. Egbert Faibille Jr., CEO, Petroleum Commission

The Petroleum Commission under the auspices of the Ministry of Energy has already commenced a couple of initiatives to make the Ghana upstream petroleum industry competitive.

This year's Local Content Conference and Exhibition offers us an opportunity to discuss very critical matters affecting the upstream oil and gas industry in Ghana the way forward. The industry has been confronted with a number of seismic changes during the decade that have compelled many countries, especially the developing world to explore innovative ways to keep their respective industries competitive. The global Energy Transition has primarily constrained the level of financing into the global oil and gas industry. Additionally, is the added responsibility of progressively reducing the industry's carbon footprint to meet nationally determined contributions and attract investment. The combined effect of these challenges make it incredibly difficult to attract investment into the industry with the oil-rich developing countries bearing the brunt of this situation.

Local content is predicated on the extent of investment into the oil and gas industry,. hence the theme for this year's conference

#### - "Attracting Exploration and Production Investments to Boost Local Content – New Pathways."

The Petroleum Commission, being institution with the responsibility to promote investment and drive local content among others has onerous responsibility of maintaining a delicate balance between investments in the sector and maximising local content. Thus, identify new ways to bring investment into the industry while working with our stakeholders to improve the results of key local content indicators such as number of contracts awarded to Ghanaian businesses and quantum(dollars) of contracts awarded to Ghanaian businesses.

The Petroleum Commission has initiated a number of proposals aimed at making the Ghana's upstream petroleum sector competitive. These proposals are receiving the needed attention at the Ministry of Energy

We at the Commission are committed to leading investors to investment opportunities

in Ghana's upstream petroleum sector. Opportunities exist in the Accra-Keta basin, Saltpond basin and the Tano basin. These opportunities may be accessed to direct negotiations and farm-in arrangement.

For a sustainable local content regime to thrive, it must be backed by accelerated and constant E&P activities. The Commission will continue to ensure that drilling and production operations are not downplayed. The Commission expects a minimum of four exploratory wells to be drilled in the first half of 2025 by four contractors who are at their exploratory phases of the Initial Exploration Period.

Having identified the inadequacies in availability of quality seismic data as a limiting factor in attracting E&P investments, the Commission forwarded a comprehensive Strategy Paper for Data Acquisition under the directive to the Ministry of Energy. The end goal is to find a sustainable financing option of seismic data acquisition to enhance the marketability of our acreages.

Aside from these initiatives, there is a continuous effort to review and address the overall policy and regulatory regime to address investor concerns.

Following the development of the Energy Transition Framework by the Ministry of Energy, the Petroleum Commission has commenced preparations to develop an **Upstream** Petroleum Transition Plan, which would provide a comprehensive guide to ensure that Ghana maximises the returns on its oil and gas resources without compromising energy transition obligations.


It is my conviction, that the 2024 LCCE will provide the platform to explore more innovative measures to attract more investments both from companies currently working in our industry and new entrants.


The Conference will also review our local content programme and identify challenges as well as areas for improvement and scaling up.
